



Explanation
Lines figures 1/2 in blue ink represent the lines of High St. as read by the Committee signing this map. These figures 1/2 in blue ink placed outside of the street lines and nearly parallel with the lot lines show, firstly the total distance of buildings fences 1/2 from A to V measured on the south or north lines of High St. Secondly what parts of said buildings 1/2 are referred to as "a few corner boards of house" or "a few corner of underpinning of house" & c. f. & c. u. f. for similar parts of a fence. Thirdly the distance which the points described are off, or on, the street as related by said Committee. The dotted lines in red ink represent the lines of High St. as laid and read and is an act of the General Assembly passed at the first session A.D. 1787 as nearly as I can ascertain from the report of said revision taken in connection with the above buildings 1/2 now standing near said lines and in connection with the map of adjoining land now open here. These lines are drawn with the blue ink from Cranston to Grade such as they are hereafter just shown in red ink & from said street from J. Haines.
